

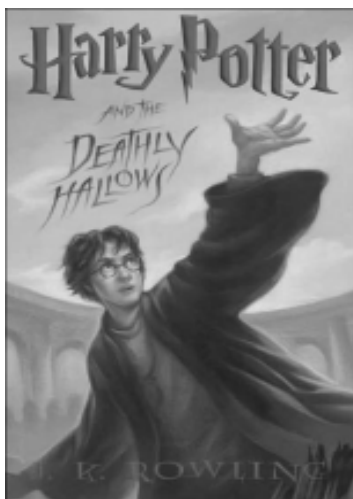

Harry Potter Cover Contest

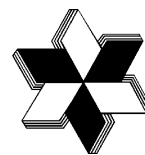

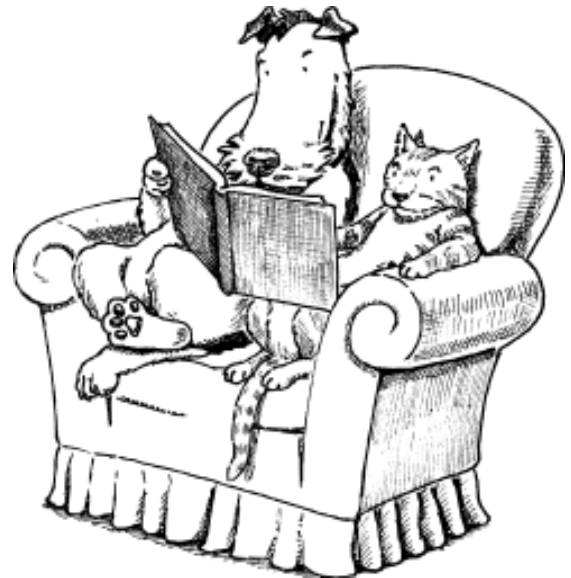
