**I. NARRATIVE**

February proved to be an important month for Library planning, programs and service delivery.

On February 4 through 6, the Library hosted the 22<sup>nd</sup> Annual African-American History Celebration featuring Grammy-nominated storyteller Diane Ferlatte. Special outreach programs were presented at Bryant, Cessna, Clark and Isley elementary schools as well as Wichita West high school and the Sedgwick County Juvenile Detention Facility. Library events were held at the Rockwell, Alford and Angelou branches and at the Kansas African-American Museum where nearly 100 people gathered for an evening of "Have I Got a Story to Tell!" The Celebration also included a Senior Wednesday presentation about the Tuskegee Airmen by Colonel George Boyd, a book discussion of *African-American Women in the Struggle for the Vote, 1850-1920* led by Dr. Daisy Karabagama and a discussion of Barack Obama's *Dreams from My Father* led by Mark Criner, Jr. 1,480 people attended the fifteen series presentations.

The Library's 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Adult Winter Reading program surpassed the 1,000 participant level for the first time: a 49% increase in participation from the 2009 program. 880 readers met their goals by reading a minimum of six books during the eight week program, reflecting an increase in program completion of 57% from the 2009 record. The success of the program attests to the fact that reading books in traditional formats is not an activity in decline in Wichita!

A building program for the proposed new Central Library received much attention after being approved by the Library Board of Directors on February 16 and presented to the City Council in a workshop on February 23. The adopted program outlines requirements for a facility of just over 156,000 s.f., 74% larger than the current Central Library. In addition to expanded space for collections, the building program provides space to triple public computing and increase public seating by 53%. Community meeting areas would be more than doubled in order to allow the Library to return to its building programming now taken offsite due to lack of space. Other spaces that would grow substantially in the programmed building are areas for young adults/teens, children, special collections (genealogy and local history), and display of new materials. Two alternate scenarios for buildings of smaller sizes were reviewed by the Board but not included in the adopted building program. In making this decision, members noted that just as it is prudent to ensure that public facilities are not built too extravagantly, it is also prudent to ensure money is not spent building facilities that are too small to meet community needs. They expressed concern about creating a facility that might be outgrown too soon, resulting in the need for more expensive expansions and suggested to the City Council that it would be preferable to build the biggest facility the budget would support, even if that meant that not all of the spaces might be as completely and nicely furnished at building opening.

## **POTPOURRI:**

The lengthy planning phase for implementation of the Knight Foundation grant for technology enhancements has been completed. Site visits to all libraries determined locations for wireless access points, necessary cable routes and arrangements for ceiling mounted digital projectors. Equipment purchases will be made under existing master contracts in order to ensure consistency with other City installations for ease of maintenance. The project plan calls for wireless access to be in place in all locations by the end of May.

Preparations for the 24th Annual Academy Award Shorts began on February 2, immediately after the announcement of award nominees. Through an agreement with Magnolia Pictures/Shorts International, all nominated live action and animated films were acquired for the program series. Four of the five documentaries were secured with an exclusive agreement with HBO for the fifth film prohibiting a Wichita screening. Although disappointed not to be showing all nominees again this year, if the final film had been acquired the complete program would have run six hours and twenty minutes without breaks, exceeding the six hour rental of the Warren Old Town theatre. Through a new option provided to the Library, permission was provided to the Wichita Eagle's Rod Pocowatchit for previewing films in advance of the first screening, enabling him to prepare a more extensive article promoting the programs. Also new to this year's series is a promotional strategy that will include use of online ads at Kansas.com.

Interlibrary Loan processes were automated successfully in February. Key features of the change include the ability for staff to immediately access and process requests while customers receive more current updates on their requests. Customer response to the change has been enthusiastic.

Road construction on Meridian in front of the Lionel Alford branch created an interesting situation when water to the building was shut off for the morning with little advanced warning. The community room had previously been rented for use by a large group that had members who had traveled for some distance to attend the meeting. To add to the difficulties, the construction blocked access to the branch drive while the water line was installed, leaving customers and staff to park in nearby restaurant parking lots and walk to the Library. After maneuvering the parking only to learn that the restrooms were temporarily out of order, the group was not happy although they understood after the situation was explained to them.

An audit of all library facilities resulted in a short list of safety issues primarily limited to the lack of fire evacuation signage, storage too close to electrical panels and a handful of repairs required by the Public Works department.

Universal service (e-rate) applications for the 2010-2011 year were submitted, as was an annual statistical report to the State Library of Kansas and an International City/County Management Association Performance Measurement survey. A report of actual expenses from the 2009 General Fund was prepared as a starting activity for 2010-2012 budgeting.

At the recommendation of Mayor Brewer, a preschool storytime at the Evergreen branch was filmed on February 24<sup>th</sup> for airing on City 7.

Earned media opportunities received during February included coverage of the library program workshop in the Wichita Eagle and on KSN, KWCH and KFDI with a follow-up story on KWCH. The Academy Award shorts program was featured on City 7's Weekend Update with promotion also planned by the Wichita Eagle, KSN, KMUW and KCTU.

Agencies receiving outreach services during January included: All Saints, Bethany Lutheran, Bryant, Cessna, Clark, Isley and St Elizabeth Ann Seton elementary schools; Ellis Street, Hilltop, Martin Luther King, Plaza de los Ninos, Riverview and Stepping Stones Head Start Centers; Marshall Middle School; Wichita East and West high schools; Honeytree Academy; New Song Academy; All Saints, Loving Arms and Tutor Time/Maple Child Care Centers; Wichita State and YMCA East Child Development Centers and the Juvenile Detention Facility.

Employees provided book deliveries to twenty homebound readers.

Employees also were presenters at the Communication in the New Age of Government conference, East Wichita Shepherd's Center, Wichita Northwest High School, the Towne East Book Blast, USD259's Teen Resource Day, two non-library book clubs and the Westside Optimist Club.

The Wulfmeyer Special Collections Center had out-of-state visitors from Colorado, Missouri, Oklahoma, and Texas.

Volunteerism remains high throughout the library system. In February, the Library received 1,085.75 hours of service from 90 volunteers. This included 48 adult volunteers, 28 Friends volunteers, 10 student volunteers, 1 intern and 3 SWEP volunteers.
