

WICHITA PUBLIC LIBRARY MONTHLY REPORT



May 2010

I. NARRATIVE

May is a time often spent organizing for the summer. This year, May also brought enhancements to the Westlink branch and technology changes for public computing users.

In many ways, the kickoff of summer reading programs begins in May as Library staff make school visits promoting summer activities at the Library. This year, those visits included 17 presentations 536 preschool students and teachers in 8 early childhood program sites, 222 presentations to 14,643 students and teachers at 43 elementary schools, and presentations to 5,279 middle and high school students during 76 classroom presentations and lunch hour booth events. Another 499 individual received information during presentations and booths at seven parent events sponsored by area schools. The impact of time spent in these visits and presentations became clear even before the end of the month as all teen volunteer positions were filled and 1,119 youth registered for reading programs on the earlier than normal May 28 first day of the summer reading season.

While the Leonard and Celia Levand Trust underwrites most costs of these summer reading programs, the Library appreciates these additional sponsors who are also contributing finisher prizes or services in support of summer programs and activities: All Star Adventures/All Star Sports, Carlos O'Kelly's, Chipotle, City of Wichita's Parks & Recreation Department, Dog 'N Shake, Freddy's Frozen Custard, Jimmy John's, Kansas State Fair, Marble Slab Creamery, McDonald's, Mr. Goodcents, Northrock Lanes, Pizza Hut, Power 93.9 KDGS Radio, Pump It Up, Roller City, Spangles, Taco Tico, Take Care Clinic at Walgreen's, Vic's Corn Popper, WATER Center, Wendy's, West Acres Bowling, Wichita Ice Center, Wichita Thunder, and the Wichita Wingnuts.

The Westlink Branch spent the majority of May offering limited service to customers while the facility was being remodeled. Changes included a new service desk with secured material returns, two self-check machines, five additional public computing laptop stations and a reconfigured media space. At the same time, a new drinking fountain was installed, sections of sidewalk on the entry plaza were replaced, and wi-fi Internet service was established within the building. Reopening day on May 20 brought 940 visitors, most of whom offered compliments for the service enhancements and the increased sense of openness created by the rearranged materials collection and public computing areas. Over 2,500 items were checked out that day, 1,050 of which were checked out at the self-check stations while an additional 1,200 items were returned by borrowers. Some customers initially claimed they were not savvy with technology but found self-check extremely easy – staff spotted a 2-year old using it by the end of the day.

The transition to alternate Internet filters after the loss of the KanGuard proxy was completed prior to the required May 31 deadline. In addition to the change of filtering services, the loss of the KanGuard proxy also required Library staff to update IP address listings with each of the electronic subscription providers from whom online products are currently received. The transfer of public stations to *OpenDNS* was practically seamless. Transition of staff workstations to the City's *8e6* filter has been more problematic, as internal City procedures have included blocking of some sites needed for collection development and reference service delivery, such as the Internet Movie Database and Disney. The City's Information Technology staff has been helpful in accommodating necessary adjustments to the City's blocking protocols in order to allow the Library's staff to regain access to needed sites as the blocks are identified.

POTPOURRI:

The Library's 2010-2013 Technology Plan approved by the Library Board at its May meeting has been certified by the State Library of Kansas. This will allow the Library to remain eligible to receive universal service (e-rate) discounts through June 30, 2013.

Although not yet in official release, wi-fi access at the Central Library has been found and actively used by customers during the past month. This live test enabled staff to identify and complete some adjustments to network configurations. Difficulties remain in allowing some wireless users to be able to connect to and print from the Library's public printers. Backordered network equipment required to complete wi-fi installations in branches was delivered late in the month, allowing staff to set a new goal of having access in place in all Library locations prior to July 1. As service is released in each branch, the additional laptop workstations provided by the Knight grant are being installed. At the same time, existing public computers are being upgraded from Office 2000 to Office 2007 so that all workstations in each location will have identical software in order to facilitate customer use and staff support.

Once again, the Library has been awarded 100% of the universal service (e-rate) subsidies for which applications have been submitted. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, these subsidies will offset the cost of just under \$70,000 of technology services.

To offset reduced purchasing power resulting from this year's cut to the materials budget, a "media swap" reassigned spoken CDs and DVDs in order to give browsing customers "new" selections in each library location. Customers are noticing and complimenting the refreshed selections in this small but well-used collections.

The Wulfmeyer Special Collections Section had out-of-state visitors from California, Florida, Illinois, Kentucky, Missouri, New Jersey, New York, Oklahoma, Ohio, Oregon, Tennessee and Texas. Staff in the area also assisted several researchers who are aiding the National Park Service with a project to potentially add the Chisholm Trail to the historic trails program. During the month a crew from a national television network visited Wichita to film a researcher using materials from the Wulfmeyer collection as part of work on a program scheduled to air in the fall.

Anne Ethen, a student at Emporia State University's School of Library and Information Management, has created an electronic street and name index to the book *Peerless Princess*. This project will be a helpful and well-used tool for local historians.

Also useful to researchers are new holdings of genealogy periodicals that have been donated by Phyllis Greif and the estate of Barbara Marsh.

After more than a decade in office, Friends of the Library Board of Governor's President Jim Erickson has resigned from the position and has been replaced by newly elected President Gail Fisher. In addition to her service on the local Friends Board, Ms. Fisher is a current member of the Friends of Kansas Libraries Board.

7,350 pounds of books and magazines that remained after the April Friends of the Library book sale were recycled.

Central Library reference librarian Katie Menon is the newly elected President of the Wichita Area Library Association.

Earned media opportunities during May included promotion of Summer Reading and Teens Read programs on the Power 93.9 Real Teens, Real Heroes show, stories about summer libraries activities and changes to the Westlink branch library in West Side Story, coverage of the "Kansans Tell Their Stories" exhibit in Active Aging, and articles about the Talking Books program on Examiner.com. Public service announcements about summer reading programs aired on KNSS Newsradio 1330 and on City7.

Carmel and Wichita Metro-Boulevard high schools; All Saints, Bethany Lutheran, Central Christian, Christ the King, Holy Savior, Resurrection, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, St. Joseph, St. Patrick and Three Angels schools; the Classical School of Wichita; Gordon Parks Academy; Ellis Street, Hilltop, Martin Luther King Jr., Riverview and Stepping Stones Head Starts; Honeytree Academy; Loving Arms, New Song, Wichita State University and East Wichita YMCA Child Care Centers; Tutor Time/Maple; Little and Midtown Early Childhood Centers; First United Methodist Church; the Juvenile Detention Facility; Martha Loving Ferrell chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution; parents of Crystal Burge's Family Child Care and Wichita Independent Neighborhoods.

Eleven homebound deliveries were completed.

121 volunteers provided 1,189 hours of service in May. This included 52 adult volunteers, 28 Friends volunteers, 1 intern, 37 student volunteers, and 3 Senior Work Experience Program (SWEP) volunteers. Two new members joined the Friends volunteer team and one new volunteer began service at the Alford branch.
