**I. NARRATIVE**

At the Wichita Public Library, 2011 was a year for turning challenges into opportunities.

Facing budget reductions, hiring freezes, staff downsizing, elimination of the Wichita Subregional Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped and the popular Audiobooks, Music & More service, employees might have found it easy to compromise quality of service delivery. What happened instead is a testament to the dedication and expertise of the department's employees: services were realigned, processes were improved and streamlined, and partnerships were expanded as the staff remained firm in its commitment to ensure that citizens receive the library services that they want and need. Although not all activities on the department's annual work plan were accomplished, there were achievements in each of the Library's five goal areas. Highlights include:

**Connect Citizens to the Online World**

- E-card capabilities were created for citizens wishing to make exclusive use of digital collections and services. More than 1,500 E-cards were in use by year end.
- E-book, employment and seasonal pathfinders on subjects such as tax return information were created and incorporated into the Library's website.
- Technology training courses were expanded to include "Staying Safe with Social Networking" and "E-Books and E-Readers."
- The Book-a-Librarian program was established to provide individual hands-on technology training sessions.
- Wichita E-Reads was created to simplify access to E-books.

**Create Young Readers through Services that Support Early Literacy**

- Enhanced programming for infants, toddlers and preschoolers included "Baby's First Storytime" and new Saturday storytime programs at the Central library.
- Four new sites were added to the Outreach storytime schedule.
- 9,827 children and 1,672 teens registered for summer reading programs: children read 152,629 books and teens read for 28,926 hours during these programs.
- Early learning computers were added to the Central Library Children's Room, Alford and Rockwell branches.
- The Children's Librarian position at the Alford branch was filled.

### **Stimulate the Community's Imagination through the Availability of Materials for Leisure Time Reading, Listening and Viewing**

- Outreach book sets were created for holiday and seasonal themes, increasing title availability for bulk loans to partner organizations without reducing inventory from the circulating collections for children and families.
- Processes for handling missing copies on hold were improved in order to provide faster fills of these requests.
- Collections at the Maya Angelou Northeast branch were rearranged for better accessibility and browsing.
- New display units at the Central Library and Westlink branch are facilitating increased use of merchandised displays.
- Use of front out materials display was expanded into all branches and sections.
- A Senior Outreach Librarian position was created to oversee the homebound delivery program and special services to senior centers and retirement communities.

### **Satisfy the Curiosity of Wichitans through Services that Support Lifelong Learning**

- Biography, literature, religion, language and travel collections were refurbished.
- Worn copies throughout the adult non-fiction collection were removed and replaced.
- Programming was anchored by the 25<sup>th</sup> annual Academy Award Shorts Film Program, the 23<sup>rd</sup> annual African-American History Celebration, the 4<sup>th</sup> consecutive Big Read – Wichita program, Senior Wednesdays and year-long Kansas 150 programming.
- “The Wartime Exhibit” and “The Fine Art of Jazz” touring exhibits proved popular with library visitors.
- Programming partnerships were established or expanded with Child Start, Hunter Health Clinic, the Workforce Alliance of South Central Kansas and the League of Women Voters Wichita/Metro.

### **Take Action to Ensure Availability of Quality Library Service for Current and Future Wichitans**

- “Focus on Community: Wichita Public Library 2011-2014 Strategic Plan” was approved by Library Board.
- Seven grant funded staff positions were eliminated.
- One General Fund position was realigned to the City Call Center.
- A computer upgrade required for PCI compliance was completed and preliminary testing for payment of fees by credit cards began.
- A reorganization plan to match service response priorities and use patterns while also providing salary savings required to offset liabilities for early retirement costs was approved by the City Manager.

## **POTPOURRI:**

A small display at Angelou branch library commemorated the fifteenth anniversary of the branch's opening and dedication in honor of Dr. Maya Angelou. The display was composed of photographs, fifteen little-known facts about the branch, and fifteen world events that have occurred since December 20, 1996.

Internationally renowned artist Chief Zacheus Olowonubi Oloruntoba of Ibadan, Nigeria visited the Angelou branch on December 16th. The art that hangs at the branch circulation desk is a piece that Chief Oloruntoba donated to the Library during one of his previous visits to Wichita.

Wichita E-Reads was released for use on December 5<sup>th</sup>. The site was created in less than half of the time normally required to start a new service. An initial collection of 1,450 titles is supplemented by public domain titles offered through Project Gutenberg. Interest in the site has been strong and reader response has been favorable. Media attention for the service included a Saturday morning segment on KWCH and a News Now segment on City7.

Winter break activities held December 27-30 were not only popular with families but also garnered significant earned media interest, with the Kansas CW, KSN, KAKE, the Wichita Eagle and KMUW all covering events. Events were also promoted in Spanish on KYQQ.

An extensive inventory project and shifting of the motor manual collection is complete. Each of the more than 6,000 manuals in the collection was examined for condition and checked in the Polaris system for item record accuracy. Materials previously housed in the Business & Technology workroom were moved to the public area, bringing the entire set of manuals back into a single collection for the first time in several years.

Although the winter is usually a time of less travel, the Wulfmeyer Center hosted out-of-state researchers from California, Colorado, Indiana, Missouri, Ohio, Oklahoma, Wisconsin, and Wyoming.

Agencies receiving outreach or special services during December included: Kansas Humane Society; Catholic Care Center; Highland Tower; Anderson, Cloud, Irving, Lawrence, McLean, Magdalen, St. Joseph/Ost and St Patrick elementary schools; East Heights' Children's Day Out; Small Wonders and Turi's Little Angels preschools; Branches and Honey Tree Academies; Loving Arms Child Care Center; All Saints, Via Christi and Wichita State University child development centers; Second Street, Riverview, and Fingerprints Head Start programs; one Boy Scout troop and five family child care home providers. Service also was established for one new homebound reader.

Materials donations during December remained strong. 424 items received as donations were added to Library collections, reflecting list price values of more than \$7,100.

Volunteers remain an essential part of the Library's service delivery. 86 individuals participated in the volunteer program during December, offering a total of 1,038.5 hours of support. This included 37 adult volunteers, 30 Friends volunteers, 17 student/teen volunteers, and 2 Senior Community Service Experience program volunteers. Their work was supplemented by 103 hours of support from seven members of the Wichita Genealogical Society board and 100 hours of support from six members of the Friends of the Library Board.
